Sanctum Studio's puppetry and animation films have been screened at festivals around the world.

Pearly Whites was developed in 2018 with funding from City of Whittlesea to raise awareness about dental hygiene. The mouth formed part of the 5m tall head Sanctum Studio built for <u>The Man Who</u> <u>Cannot Sleep</u>, White Night 2018.

ARTIST BIOS

Lachlan Plain (director, writer, stage manager, puppeteer)

His work as artistic director of Sanctum Studio has been described as, 'forg[ing] a dark and surreal dystopia, packed with visual surprises,' (The Age 2018). Sanctum Studio tours giant puppets to festivals around Australia. It won a Green Room Award for *Life is a Carousel* (Melbourne International Festival of Puppetry, 2018). Lachlan's puppet and animated short films have screened at St Kilda Film Festival, Revelations Perth International Film Festival and American Independent Film Festival. (sanctumstudio.com.au)

In 2012 Lachlan Plain won the Impress Prize for *The Lost Journals of Pedro Piscator and other tales*, published by Impress Books (UK). He has been published in Australian journals such as Going Down Swinging and Page Seventeen. He is responsible for various murals around Melbourne, including the 300m2 *Life on Planet Daisyworld* in Fitzroy (2014).

He works for the anarchic giant puppet company, Snuff Puppets, touring with them through Australia, Denmark, Sweden, Germany, Portugal, South Korea, Thailand, Brazil and Chile (<u>snuffpuppets.com</u>).

He lives with his family on a permaculture property on the outskirts of Melbourne.

Tim Ratcliffe (performer, co-writer)

Tim has worked in many and varying roles over the years in production and performance, working with differing makers over the years, including – Punctum Theatre, Such as They Are, Sanctum Theatre, Castlemaine State Festivals RKM and The Freda Experience, The Village, National Trust of Victoria, Castlemaine Theatre Company and Humour Foundation.

Julian Chapple (performer, puppeteer, co-writer)

Chapple creates artistic projects which incorporate installations, theatre, storytelling and puppetry for festivals and schools. He is committed to connecting with people of all abilities and age groups, producing live experiences that entertain, inspire, challenge and amaze.

Born and raised in the inglorious outer suburbs of Melbourne, Australia, Julian creates works across various disciplines to distill life's bounty into intimate, censorial and surreal art experiences. He has studied Zoology, Geography and Animation.

His performance background includes ongoing work with The Village Festival, Sanctum Theatre, Magic Lantern Studio and Snuff Puppets.
